School Responsibilities:

Leroy Massey Elementary School will:

1. Provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards by:

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.

*Parent/teacher conferences are held each 9 weeks. It is discussed in each conference what each party involved should do concerning the child's education (School Compact).

*Parent Conferences may be held at an as needed basis at the request of parents or teachers.

*Conferences can be arranged at a mutually agreed upon time.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's

progress.

*Progress Reports are sent home every 4-½ weeks

*Report Cards are sent home every 9 weeks

*Take home folders are sent home weekly with graded papers

*Daily reports are sent home through student agendas
